EBSB ranked 34th on the list of large employers that participated in the survey.



"Eighty two percent of EBSB employees responded to the survey, which is phenomenal, says Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer Richard J. Gavegnano. It was that survey that earned us a Top Places to Work designation and that has given us ideas on how to be even better.
